Hide and Safely Store Poisonous Household Products

Almost any household product can be dangerous to your pet, even those labeled "safe" or "natural" (including homemade products). Here are a few poisonous products to keep safely stored away from your pets. See a full list of poisonous household products here.

- Antifreeze, deicer
- Ammonia
- Bleach or bleach-based cleaners
- Carpet or rug cleaner/shampoo/deodorizer
- Essential oils
- Plant fertilizer
- · Glue, other adhesives
- Laundry or dishwasher detergent
- Paint, solvents, spackle
- Rat/mouse/slug bait or other insecticides
- Vinegar (plain or mixed with water)
- · Window cleaner



Know Which Human Medications are Poisonous to Pets

Just because a medication is safe for you does not mean it is safe for your pet. Here are some of the more common over-the-counter (OTC) and prescription medications that are considered harmful to pets. See a full list of human medications that are poisons for pets here.

- Acetaminophen (Tylenol*)
- ADD and ADHD medications (including Adderall* and Ritalin*)
- Allergy/Decongestant medications (including Mucinex-D*, Claritin-D*, and Allegra-D*)
- Antidepressants
 (including Effexor®, Lexapro®, and Prozac®)
- Aspirin
- Blood pressure medications (including Toprol* and Lopressor*)
- Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs/NSAIDs (including Motrin*, Advil* and Aleve*)
- Sleep aids
 (including Ambien® and Lunesta®)
